



## **ART MATERIALS NEEDED FOR EACH OF THE EYEBALL IT!® PROJECTS:**

### **PROJECT #1: Buildings Mural**

white drawing paper 18”x 24”

drawing pencils, eraser, sharpener

oil pastels, wax crayons, colored pencils

watercolors

glue

Tools: scissors, brushes

Substitutions: any clean paper you have, including the inside surface of large paper bags (brown is fine) and large envelopes.

### **PROJECT #2: Relief Collage, and Drawing Exercise #1**

colored paper 12”x 18”

white drawing paper 18”x 24”

drawing pencils, eraser, sharpener

oil pastels, wax crayons, colored pencils

tempera/poster paints

watercolors

glue

Tools: scissors, brushes, stapler (optional), masking tape (optional)

Substitutions: any clean paper you have, including the inside surface of large paper bags (brown is fine) and large envelopes.

### **PROJECT #3: Sculpture with Found Materials (Junk!), and Drawing Exercise #2**

collection of found materials, suggestions in Project #3 chart at end of Project

glue, masking tape

For paper mache: baking flour, water

For plaster bandages: plastercloth or plaster strips (not included in Materials Kits)

tempera paint

Tools: brushes, scissors, stapler (optional)

drawing pencils, eraser, sharpener

watercolors

oil pastels, wax crayons, colored pencils

### **PROJECT #4: Imagination Painting, and Drawing Exercise #3**

white drawing paper 18"x 24"

watercolors

tempera/poster paints

Tools: brushes

drawing pencils, eraser, sharpener

oil pastels, wax crayons, colored pencils

Substitutions: any clean paper you have, including the inside surface of large paper bags (brown is fine) and large envelopes.

### **PROJECT #5: Clay Sculpture**

self-hardening potters clay (this is a separate Materials order)

tempera/poster paints

Tools: brushes, and please see Project directions for tool options for shaping clay

## **PROJECT #6: Color Likes to Move!**

white drawing paper 18"x 24"

watercolors

tempera/poster paints

optional: colored paper for final project

Tools: brushes

drawing pencils, eraser, sharpener

oil pastels, wax crayons

Substitutions: any clean white paper you have, including the inside surface of large white paper bags and large white envelopes.

## **Eyeball It!® Letters and Numbers for 4-6 year-olds:**

white drawing paper 12"x 18"

watercolors

tempera/poster paints

Tools: these are different for the young kids than for older kids. **Thicker is better.**

brushes – mid-size to large with thicker, shorter handles. (The brushes specified in the materials kit for the older kids would be fine.). Do not use small brushes like the ones that come with the watercolors for young kids.

thicker, beginner pencils (these pencils are available from most office supply stores, like Staples, Office Depot, etc. and from manufacturer [weareticonderoga.com](http://weareticonderoga.com) ) plus eraser, sharpener

thick oil pastels, thick wax crayons, thick colored pencils if available

Substitutions: any clean white paper you have, including the inside surface of large white paper bags and large white envelopes.
